


WE NEED TO START SWITCHING

You can begin at the flick of a switch. In fact, we've found that **nearly half** (45%) of decision makers leave their equipment in the workplace on overnight, but 65% do not know how much energy their equipment uses during this time.








..... INVISIBLE WASTE

OF COURSE, SOME BUSINESSES MUST KEEP CERTAIN PIECES OF EQUIPMENT ON OVERNIGHT BUT, FOR MANY, THE REASONS AREN'T ESSENTIAL. OUR RESEARCH SHOWS THAT BUSINESSES AREN'T SWITCHING OFF BECAUSE:

There are pieces of office equipment that don't need to stay in standby overnight, and it's important to recognise the impact this is having. In a small business with 50 computers, for example, if all are left in standby mode overnight this equates to 5,840 kWh of energy a year, totalling an extra £1,635 a year, as opposed to if these are switched off.1

Additionally, if an office has just two photocopiers on standby overnight, this could waste an unnecessary 2,137 kWh of electricity a year, totally £598. It's clear that as these figures quickly stack up across equipment in the workplace, switching equipment off when possible is a great first step.



We know that switching off isn't the solution for every machine, such as servers, nor every department in a business, such as 24/7 customer services, and so we've partnered with sustainability experts to explore additional options...

"Measuring energy usage through submeters can build a bigger picture of where and when energy is being used and help you to focus on areas where big savings are up for grabs, as well as monitoring how efforts are performing over time."

"Does your space need to be cooled to an icebox in summer? Do your security lights need strong halogen bulbs? Dig into thought processes like these and ask yourself whether energy guzzling practices are essential or only in place by default."

Say you need a machine to be on by the time you reach the office, rather than leaving it on all night, smart technologies can put equipment on a timer. If you can't completely turn off, consider equipment that has energy-saving night modes."

For co-working firm Work.Life, reconsidering the design of the office with a sustainability hat on is key to cutting energy. For example, installing a water dispenser that provides hot and chilled water has reduced the need for multiple kettles and large ice machines.

Our research shows that when buying equipment 84% of decision makers look for high energy efficiency ratings and 94% say sustainability is an important aspect, but what exactly should you be looking for?

Look for product settings that can give you a helping hand such as BRITA VIVREAU's energy-saving night mode within its Extra C-Tap water dispenser



For appliances that can't be switched off or go into standby, consider reducing how many of these machines you need. For example, installing a water dispenser would save considerable space in a drink's fridge
